Just a few really quick updates for everyone as I channel Frank Costanza – I'll do my best to keep out of your emails until Friday morning!

OSBCU Wage Survey - As many of us know, currently all public sector wages have been frozen by the Ford government at a rate of 1% per year by legislation. That legislation expires at the end of our current contract at the end of August 2022. The OSBCU has generated a wage survey that is going to be very important as we move forward towards Central Negotiations where our wages are negotiated for all 55,000 CUPE Education workers across the province. It's very important that the OSBCU hears from YOU! Yes YOU! Your input and opinion are important. Please take a few minutes to click the link below and complete the survey. I know some people don't usually make the time for these types of things, but this should not be one of those times. Our wages have fallen behind inflation and cost of living for over a decade now and our buying power has decreased so in effect we're making less money now than all those years ago. I've included both the data sheet issued by CUPE National and a link to the Ontario Human Rights Commission for members to read and be aware of when asking about whether what is happening is legal or not and also infringing on their rights or not.</u>
