





Members Update for December 10th, 2021

<u>Christmas Break</u> – One week to go until we get a bit of peace and quiet and can focus on some tasks that we don't have the time for during the instructional days!

Holiday Travels – (leaving this on from last week) There's been quite a few questions about what rules have to be followed about travelling over the break. Things are changing almost daily with travel restrictions and guidelines from the Federal government with a new Covid variant surfacing recently. If you are taking time off and traveling during the break, the HWDSB will require you to be ready to work when school resumes and it's up to you to know the guidelines about traveling to your destination and the conditions of isolating or quarantining upon your return. Our suggestion is to be in contact with your travel agent and keep an eye on the Federal guidelines by following this link. I already know of a few members who have had to cancel their travel plans due to recent changes so please be aware of the situation.

EasyConnect – Mark Lachowicz, Geoff Thompson and myself had a meeting with the employer about ongoing concerns with the so called "Easy"Connect system on Monday. We discussed a few of the major issues that members are facing such as 4/6 hour permanent positions not being able to access the system to arrange their own top up hours as well as the delay in setting up daytime "floaters" to access the system for daytime coverages. There seems to be some confusion as to whether the delays in getting these items in place and operational are from EasyConnect or the employer but we were assured that a timeline would be supplied to us for when they would be accessible by our members. In addition to those items, we again proposed that the system be put on the shelf until it can function properly but that request went about as far as a bird flying against the wind with no wings. Needless to say, the introduction of this software to replace a scheduling supervisor has been a train wreck for months now and I'm not confident that it will ever function the way it was advertised.

<u>OSBCU Conference Update -</u> Patrick Cumbo, Pat Amatangelo and myself attended the OSBCU Leadership Conference last weekend from Friday afternoon to Sunday afternoon. This was the first in person conference that CUPE Ontario has hosted since March of 2020 and it was done very well. We discussed Central Bargaining issues, member mobilization issues and the general feel of CUPE Education Workers across Ontario. <u>We will have information to share with you about bargaining priorities, possible bargaining dates and more, but I'll hold off on that until January when we don't have the holiday season, family commitments and possible travel plans on our minds. Spoiler alert – the main objective in Central Bargaining next year will be wages. That was loud and clear from the over 16,000 surveys done by members earlier this year and submitted to the OSBCU.</u>

One of the local reps (steward or Executive) will be by your school either this afternoon or sometime on Monday to collect your donations and bring them to the office.
