



Members Update for May 27th, 2022

Provincial Election Next Week! - Some people are engaged in politics and keep track of things municipally, provincially and federally. Others, not so much. Next week we'll have a provincial election to see who the next Premier of Ontario will be and more importantly, who will bargain with all public sector employees across the province on their wages and other important issues. The current Conservative government implemented Bill 124 capping our annual increases on wages to 1% over the last 3 years. It is expected that if re-elected with a majority government that Doug Ford would again cap our wage increases or worse yet – freeze them (no increases) like the Liberals and Dalton McGuinty did many years ago. If you take the time to check the party platforms on education issues – the NDP position is that they will hire 20,000 more education workers and work to end violence in schools which we all know is a growing problem. The Liberal platform mentions hiring 10,000 more teachers and one additional EA per school. Of course there are many other factors that determine who you will vote for – but these are issues that directly could affect your income and job satisfaction over the coming years. Advance polls are now open if you want to vote before June 2nd – you can find out where you should be voting and when advance polls are open by checking your voters card or check the Ontario website at https://www.elections.on.ca/en/voting-in-ontario.html
