



## Quick Update for June 22nd, 2023

<u>Congratulations</u> – Thanks to all our members that voted in the 3 Year Trustee election today. We had 183 votes cast and the successful candidate was Chris Cosby. I want to welcome Chris to our Trustee team that helps us keep on top of our finances and ensures that our spending and record keeping is done properly.

<u>Casuals and Strike Days</u> – Just a bit of an update for our casual members. I spoke with OSBCU last night and confirmed with them that any casual that was in an LTO assignment or had already booked jobs for November 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 – they are entitled to be paid for their scheduled shifts on those days as per the Central Agreement. Casuals who were not in an LTO assignment or had not picked up jobs for those days already are not entitled to the two days pay.

As of 5pm tonight, I haven't heard back from HR yet on the quickest and easiest way to make those members whole who haven't received payment for those two days. It could be that it will be easier for our members to email HR directly with some information or it might be easier for HR to contact our members based on the list they have compiled. Again, as soon as I know what will be easiest – I will let everyone know.
